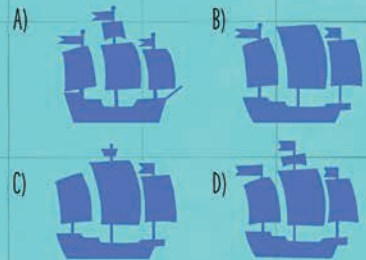

### Shrimp

A small sea creature with a shell, four pairs of legs and long feelers.



### Shore crab

A small crab that hunts in rock pools.



### Starfish

A sea creature with five 'arms'.



### Anemone

Uses its stinging tentacles to catch other animals.



### Limpet

Sea snail with a very hard shell.

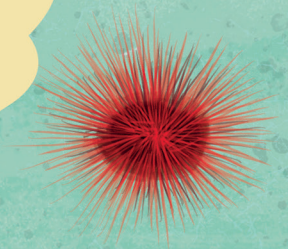


### Stickleback

Fish with spiny fins on its back.

### Blenny

Small fish with big eyes. Lives at the bottom of rock pools.



### Sea urchin

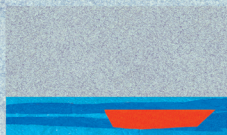
Has a very spiky shell and clings to rocks.

# Scrap paper sea scene

## A boat on water



1. Glue some strips of blue paper across the bottom of a piece of paper. Cut out the hull of a boat and glue it on top.



2. Cut a thin strip for a mast and glue it on. Then, add a sail. Draw some ropes at the bottom and the top of the sail.



3. Dip a dry brush into thick white paint and dab it across the bottom of the boat, as the wash behind the boat.

You could draw some birds in the sky with a white pencil.

## Stormy clouds

Rip or cut out cloud shapes from recycled paper and glue them across the sky.

## Fishing boat

Copy these paper shapes to make a fishing boat. Use different papers for the cabins, mast and sail.

## Cardboard cruiser

You could use cardboard to make the hull of a boat. Add paper masts and sails.

Make lots of different boats sailing across a piece of paper.

This sea was made from overlapping strips of tissue paper.

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# SET SAIL

Make sails and a mast for a model boat, such as the origami sampan from pages 90-91.

You will need some paper, a pencil and a straw.

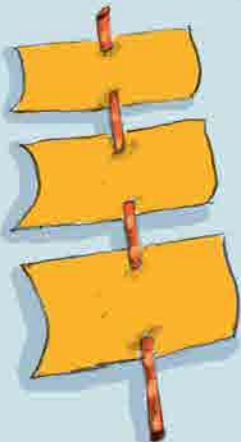
- 1 Cut three rectangles out of paper. They should be the same width as your model, but different heights.



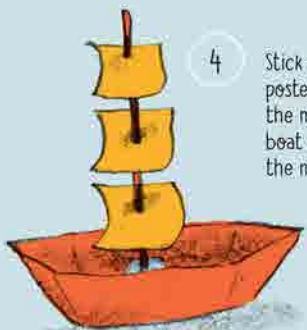
- 2 Using the point of a pencil, make a hole at the top and bottom of each sail.



- 3 Thread a straw through the three sails, from biggest to smallest.



- 4 Stick a blob of poster tack in the middle of your boat and secure the mast in place.



Make a mast with two sails if you like.



Instead of the origami sampan, you could use an upturned shallow plastic container or lid for a boat.

# TEST THE WATERS

Fill a tray with water and play these games with your boat.



## OBSTACLE COURSE

Place a small stone in the middle of the tray. With a straw, blow the boat around the stone, trying not to touch it or the sides of the tray.



## BLOW BY BLOW

Each player tries to blow the boat across the water to hit the opposite side. You score a point each time you manage to hit your opponent's side of the tray.



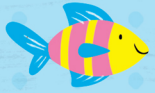
# AROUND THE WORLD IN 1,082 DAYS

\* This narrow passage of water near the tip of South America connects the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. It was named after Magellan's successful crossing.



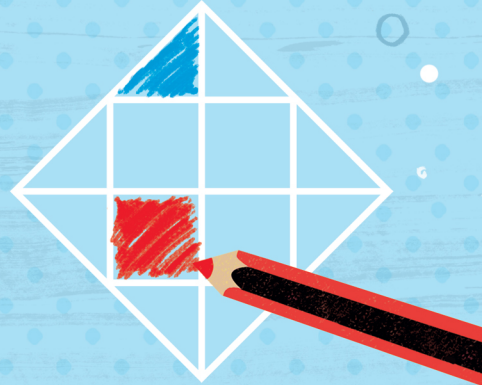
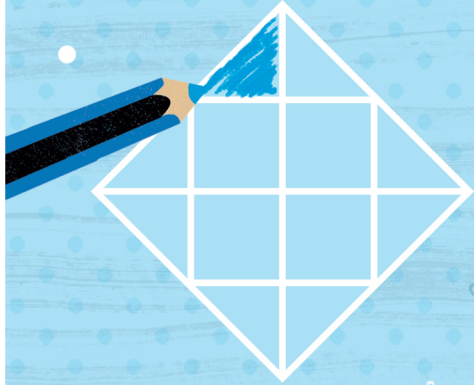


# How to play Shade

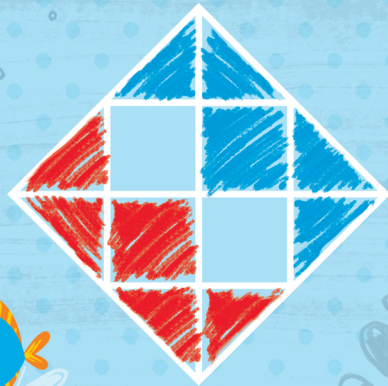
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- 1 Blue starts the game by filling in one part of the pattern with their pen.
- 2 Red fills in another part with a different pen, avoiding the parts that share an edge with Red's.

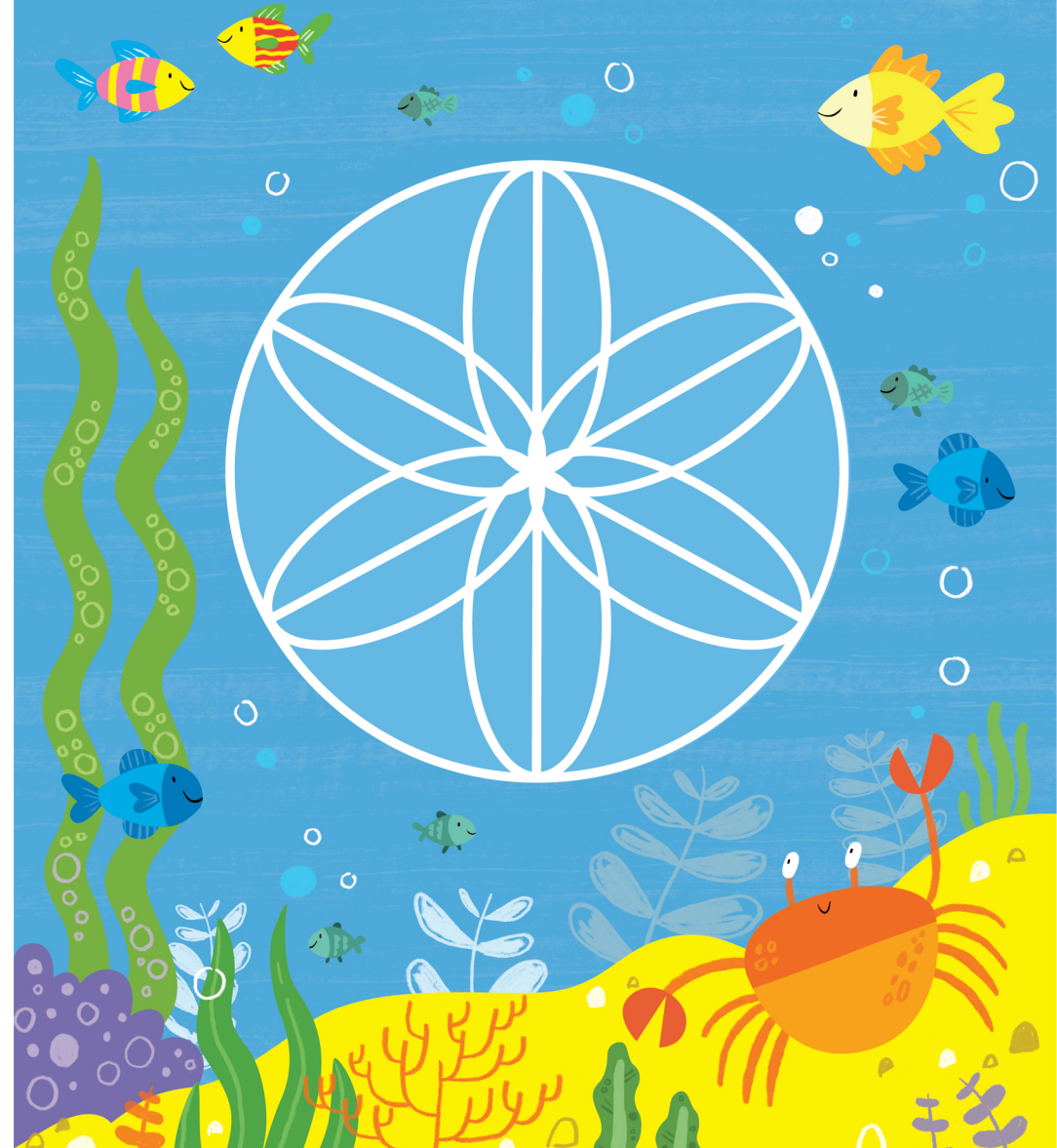


- 3 Take turns to fill in more parts, so that areas that touch along an edge are always the same shade.
- 4 The last player to fill in a part wins. Blue can't fill in a shape, so Red has won this game. Take turns to start games.



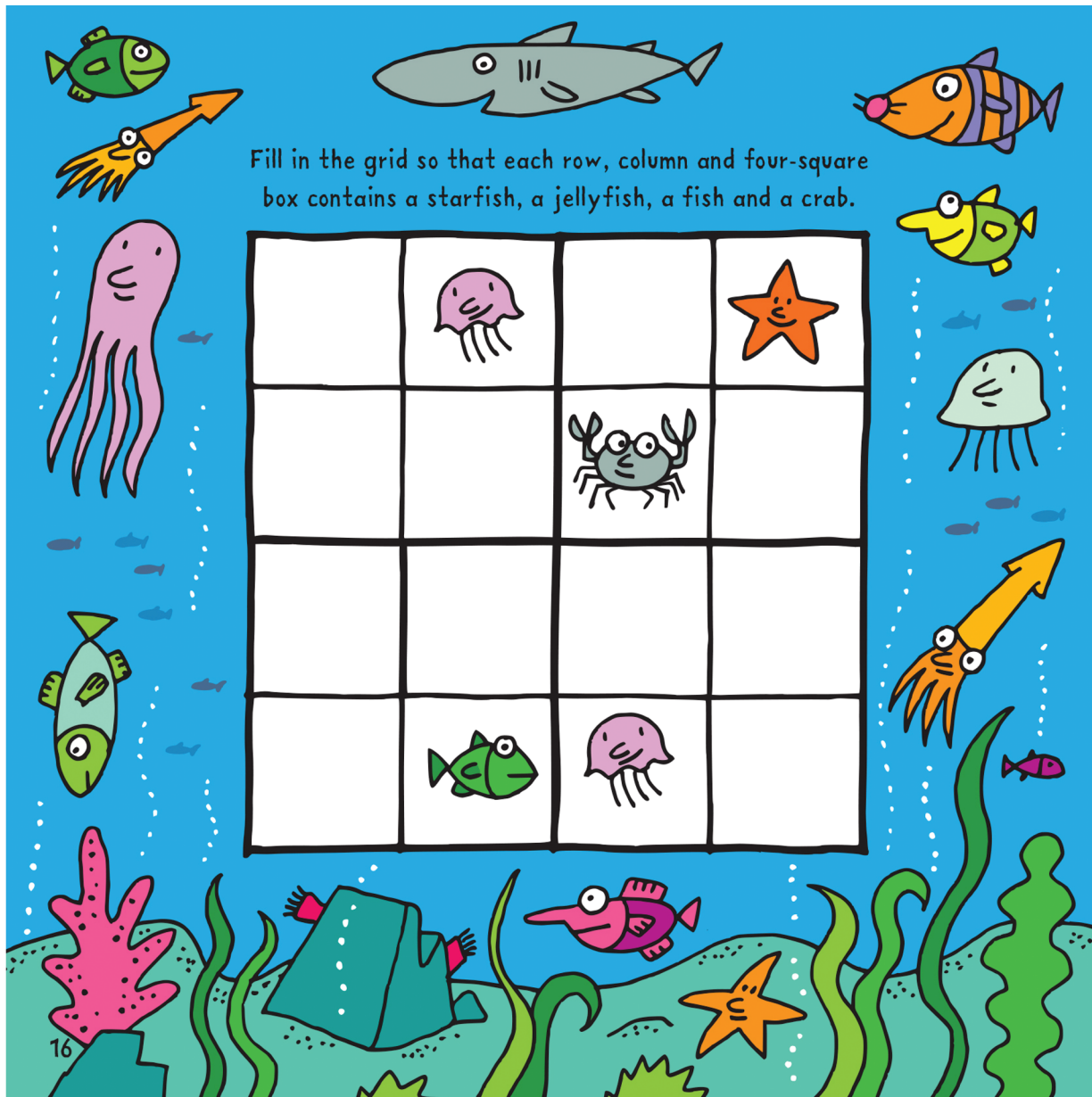
