


It's so magical when it snows. On these pages, you can make your own snowflakes and solve some snowy puzzles.

Stunning snowflakes


To make a six-pointed paper snowflake, you just need a piece of paper, a bowl, a pencil and a pair of scissors.




 Draw around a small bowl
 on paper. Then, cut out the circle and fold it in half.



- TIP: If the edges aren't lining up, redo step 2 and adjust the fold.
- 3. Turn the paper over. Fold over the half on the left, so that all the edges line up.




 Fold over one third of
 the half circle, so that the edges line up.



Praw these shapes, then cut
them out. Unfold the paper to reveal a snowflake.


SNOWFLAKE SHAPES

To make more snowflakes, cut out these shapes:















Colour and make a Unipiggle Fairy Freeze paper chain

I. Colour in the strips.

2. Use scissors to carefully cut along the dotted lines.

3. Glue or tape one strip to make a loop. Continue to loop each strip through the next, securing with glue or tape each time until you have a fun and festive paper chain.
