


Make a bunny hat

...to wear to an Easter party.

- 1 Cut a strip of thick white paper that fits around your head.
- 2 Draw on a face like this.
- 3 Cut a slit going down near one end...





- 4 ...and a slit going up near the other end.
- 5 Bend it around and slot the slits together.
- 6 Fold white paper in half.



- 7 Cut it like this to make ears.
- 8 Draw a pink patch on each one.



- 9 Fold the bottom edges together and glue.
- 10 Stick the ears onto the hat.

Decorated eggs



1. Crack an egg sharply on the rim of a mug. Then, carefully break the egg in half over the mug.



2. Wash the eggshells and leave them to dry completely. Brush white glue along the cracked edge of one half.



3. Fit the other half on top. Brush glue around the crack to seal it. Put it in an egg carton to dry.



4. Rip some tissue paper into small pieces. Then, brush the top half of the egg with white glue.



5. Press the pieces of paper onto the wet glue. Add more glue and paper until the top is covered.



6. When the glue is dry, cover the bottom half with tissue paper in the same way. Leave it to dry.



7. Mix some paint with a little white glue. Paint one half of the egg. When it is dry, paint the rest.



8. When the paint is dry, mix other paints with glue. Decorate your egg with flowers and spots.

Make up patterns of your own or use the ideas below.


Bunny napkin rings




1. Fold a stiff piece of paper, the length of your hand, in half. Draw half the shape of a bunny's head.




2. Cut around the shape of the head. Open out the paper and use felt-tip pens to draw a face.




3. For the body, draw a rectangle on a piece of thick paper. Make it twice the length of your hand.




4. Add two bumps at one end for the feet. Draw a dotted line a little way in from the other end.



5. Draw another line about a hand's length along. Cut out the shape. Fold it along the dotted lines.



6. Put some glue along the short edge and curve the paper over. Stick the edge behind the feet.



7. Turn the head over and put two blobs of glue below the ears. Press the head onto the body.



8. For a tail, pull a piece off a cotton ball. Roll it into a ball and glue it on the back of the body.

To bend a bunny's ear, roll it around a pencil.


Make paper birds

These fluttery birds make lovely springtime decorations.

- 1 Draw around a bowl on paper.




- 2 Cut out the circle...



- 3 ...and fold it in half.



- 4 Fold gently in half and cut like this.




- 5 Unfold and draw an eye near one corner.



- 6 Fold a piece of paper from the short edge.




- 7 Turn it over and fold it again.



- 8 Keep turning and folding.



Whole sheet folded




Snip the end of the tail if you like.

You could add string to hang your bird up.

- 9 Push the folded paper through the slit.



- 10 Draw a rectangle around your fingers on paper.



- 11 Cut it out.




- 12 Fold in half.



- 13 Draw lines like this.



- 14 Cut along the lines.




Beak
